Tour to Québec City

Classified by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site in 1985, the city of Québec, capital of the province of Québec, is the only remaining entirely fortified city in North America and dominates the St. Lawrence River. Founded in 1608 by Samuel de Champlain, Québec was the first permanent European settlement in New-France. The city's buildings and monuments are models of its rich architectural history and give Québec its renowned European flair. During the tour, you will see the Plains of Abraham, the Notre-Dame Church, Place-Royale, the National Assembly, the Citadelle and the famous Château Frontenac. See if you can resist the ambiance of Québec City! There will be some free time for lunch on your own.

Then, enjoy a guided tour of Ottawa. Over the past century, this former lumber town has gracefully blossomed into a cosmopolitan city filled with neo-gothic government buildings, gardens and parks. With the help of a professional guide, we will drive along Sussex Drive, the Byward Market, and the Rideau Canal and discover the many historical and charming facets of our capital city. You will have free time for lunch on your own.

From the foundation of Fort Ville-Marie in 1642 to today's modern city, find out more about all the eras that shaped Montréal. After lunch, you will visit the museum of Archeology, also called Pointe-à-Callières. It is recognized as a national historical and archaeological site, leading visitors through centuries of history. The museum opened in 1992 and is the result of over 10 years of archeological digging. It showcases major archaeological discoveries made on this site, from the 1980's to today. This walking tour will take you in the heart of Old Montréal and the Old Port and also includes a visit of the Notre-Dame Basilica and a 3-course lunch in a local restaurant.
